This Health and Safety Plan will serve as the agency guideline regarding on-site and remote staff, child, and family service activities surrounding coronavirus. Given the dynamic nature of the coronavirus pandemic, this plan incorporates as much flexibility as possible to adapt to changing conditions. This plan ensures staff, the children and families, the agency Health Services Advisory Committee, Policy Council, and Board are fully informed and prepared for the phased reopening of our preschool facilities. The 2021/2022 Preschool year will begin with in-person instruction on the single start date of Wednesday, August 25, 2021. It is anticipated our program will operate under the premise of Phase 2 of this Health and Safety Plan.

Topics covered in this plan are listed in alphabetical order. Phase 1, the phase highlighted in red, means staff will be working remotely and in-person services will not be offered. Phase 2, the phase highlighted in yellow, means all aspects of Head Start services will be offered with extreme caution. Phase 3, the phase highlighted in green, means Head Start services will progress towards typical as much as possible.
